When I am not busy networking with professionals in the state, I am communicating with healthcare professionals around the country who have an interest in making Wyoming their home. Acting as an ambassador for Wyoming and promoting all that we have to offer is one of my favorite aspects of this position. I am able to draw on my experiences from growing up in Gillette, and from driving across the state to ski at resorts; White Pine, Hogadon, Grand Targhee, and Snowy Range. It didn't hurt that I married a boy from Rock Springs who showed me the beauty of the Red Desert or that I worked for the Wyoming Game and Fish Department traveling back roads-like the one from Laramie to Douglas-that have absolutely breathtaking views. Knowing this state and all the gifts it has to offer is essential for someone working to recruit the best healthcare providers. Just recently I recruited a PA from Louisiana who emailed me after his drive across the state to tell me how much he loved seeing the speedgoats on his travels. I convinced him that Wyoming was the place to be and after meeting with the amazing people here in Wyoming, he knew it was too.

It has been an incredible pleasure to step into this role and help increase the recruiting and retention efforts for healthcare professionals across Wyoming. Future projects for WHRN include a nationally advertised career fair located in Wyoming as well as increased outreach to promote healthcare careers with
