Important Changes for Specialty Formula

Wyoming Medicaid is transitioning to cover specialty infant formulas for medical reasons, as requested by the Wyoming WIC program. Here's what families and providers need to know:

- No Change for Standard Formulas: Families using Similac Advance, Sensitive, Total Comfort, or Soy Isomil can still get these through WIC as usual.
- For Children Ages 0–2: Specialty formulas are now available through Medicaid pharmacy benefits. Providers must submit a Pharmacy Prior Authorization (PA) form:

What Should WMS Members Expect in Medicare?

House Resolution 1 saw versions that held promise for sweeping changes to Medicare reimbursement including long-term payment stability and much-needed updates for physicians. WMS members can expect a **temporary one-year increase of 2.5% to the Physician Fee Schedule**starting January 1, 2026. Unfortunately, the House attempts to address longstanding challenges in Medicare reimbursement did not survive the Senate process.

Summary of Medicare Provisions in 2025 Reconciliation Bill

Current law (prior to enactment of reconciliation bill)

House-passed bill

Physician Fee Schedule Conversion Factor Adjustment	Medicare payment rates to physicians and other clinicians under the Physician Fee Schedule are determined in part by a scaling factor, known as the conversion factor, which is updated each year. Under current law, conversion factor updates are based on statutory factors and other budgetary requirements, and do not vary based on changes in inflation in medical practice costs. Beginning in 2026, the Physician Fee Schedule conversion factor is scheduled to increase by 0.25% each year for most Medicare providers. Beginning in 2026, Medicare physicians and other clinicians who participate in qualified Advanced Alternative Payment Models (A-APMs) are scheduled to receive financial incentives in the form of higher annual increases to the Physician Fee Schedule conversion factor (0.75% vs. 0.25% for all other providers). This provision is meant to replace the annual bonus payments currently offered to qualified A-APM participants, which are due to expire in January 2027.	Replaces the current schedule of annual statutory increases to the Physician Fee Schedule conversion factor with annual increases tied to the Medicare Economic Index (MEI), a measure of inflation in medical practice costs. The conversion factor will be increased by 75% of the projected increase in the MEI in 2026, and by 10% of the projected increase in the MEI in all subsequent years. Applies the same schedule for annual MEI-based conversion factor increases to all Medicare providers, regardless of participation in A-APMs. Effective Date: January 1, 2026.	Provides a temporary one-year increase of 2.5% to the Physician Fee Schedule conversion factor for all services furnished between January 1, 2026 and January 1, 2027.

NONCOMPETE CLAUSE RESTRICTIONS

Noncompete Agreement Restrictions Effective July 1

BCBS LAWSUIT AND SETTLEMENT

Claim Submission Due July 29, 2025

The November 2024 Blue Cross Blue Shield (BCBS) lawsuit impacting physicians resulted in a \$2.8 billion antitrust settlement. The lawsuit, initiated in 2012, alleged that BCBS colluded to limit competition and lower reimbursement.

Physicians who provided healthcare services and submitted claims to BCBS between July 24, 2008, and October 4, 2024, are eligible to submit claims for a share of the settlement. Approximately \$160 million of the full settlement was specifically allocated for professional providers.

The settlement aims to address antitrust violations and promote fair competition within the healthcare industry. It is expected to bring changes to how BCBS operates, potentially leading to more competitive pricing and improved services for providers and patients.

The WWAMI Admissions Committee is excited to announce an open position. If you are interested in applying, we encourage you to do so. Please make sure to submit your application by the deadline of **August 11, 2025.**

The Wyoming Admissions Committee consists of four Wyoming-based physicians who are appointed to staggered three-year terms, with the possibility of serving an additional three years.

Committee members are tasked with interviewing Wyoming applicants who meet specific academic qualifications for medical school admission.
